# **RECOMMENDATION:**

# **DISCUSSION:**

At a previous meeting, the Board raised several questions regarding street lighting. The District will be assuming financial responsibility for two different street lighting systems.

Decorative Historic Lights - The District will own and maintain approximately 20 historic decorative lights that primarily front Main Street. These light will be owned and maintained by District staff or a sub-contractor (not PG&E). The Decorative light are separately metered and the District will pay PG&E the electric charge per the LS-3 PG&E rate schedule.

Cobra Head Lights - These 23 lights are owned and maintained by PG&E and spread throughout the residential streets. The District only pays the electric charge per the LS-1 PG&E rate schedule (currently approximately \$522/month), which includes any maintenance.

Both lighting systems costs have been accounted for in the SHN Rate Study.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Administrative staff recommends that the Board review the Draft Final Budget for FY 2016/17 and provide staff with any comments or questions.

# **ACTION:**

Direct staff to prepare the SCSD FY 2016/17 Final Budget, for the Public Hearing and consider adoption on June 16, 2016.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The FY 2016/17 Draft Final Budget (draft budget) was developed, by staff, utilizing information contained in the March 2016 SHN Engineers & Geologists (SHN) Combined User Fee and Benefit Assessment Reports Summary. The SCSD Board, at the March 17, 2016 meeting, directed staff to develop a draft budget that included Personnel Services costs for contracted services *only* for FY 2016/17. The contracted services costs are divided into three (3) categories; Maintenance/Operations Staff, Administrative Staff and Other Staff. The Contracted Personnel Services costs are included in the draft budget and the account code spreadsheets for Funds, Revenues and Expenditures are attached. The draft budget does *not* include any debt financing or any tax refund/revenue from the County. The draft budget *does* include \$439,875 to be transferred to the Capital Reserve Fund (account 510), \$123,160 to be transferred to the Equipment Replacement Fund (account 520) and an Unexpended Fund Balance of \$93,574.

Staff is working with the Town of Scotia (TOS) to develop a draft "Transition Agreement" (Agreement) between the District (SCSD) and (TOS) for the first FY 2016/17 *only* of SCSD operations. The Agreement will define the process to transfer ownership and operations of specific assets from TOS to SCSD. The Agreement will also provide contract services and support for essential SCSD operations (fire protection, treated water and wastewater). The Agreement will be presented to the Board for review and approval, as soon as possible.

The FY 2016/17 Final Budget (budget) is required, by law, to be approved and adopted, by Resolution, prior to September 1, 2016. Staff recommends that the Board consider adoption of the budget on June 16, 2016.

The proposed transfer date for each of the following schedules is "On Demand," meaning as soon as the Scotia CSD is organized and authorized to accept transfer or receipt of the vehicles and/or equipment with that transfer notation, and the CSD Board or its General Manager makes that request or demand. The CSD first needs to be staffed, insured and authorized to take title, ownership or control, and to relieve TOS of equipment maintenance and repair responsibility.

As LAFCo recognized in Resolution 10-09 approving Scotia Community Services District formation, some of the vehicles or equipment listed in the following inventory may be retired from service, or possibly replaced or consolidated with comparable equipment, prior to the time that Town of Scotia Company LLC (TOS) conveys said equipment to the Scotia CSD. Therefore, failure to convey particular pieces of equipment from this list, where documented as being retired from service, will not constitute non compliance with the conditions of approval for CSD formation. (See Resolution 10-09 Attachment C page. 2) TOS LLC stands ready to make such transfer promptly as soon as requested. It is anticipated that such final transfers will be authorized, requested and completed over the course of time, through as long as a year or more following Certification of Completion.

#### ATTACHMENT C

The real property assets to be transferred from TOS to the Scotia CSD, at no cost to the CSD, shall include:

- · the water intake structure along the Eel River and associated appurtenances and piping;
- the raw water supply for fire-fighting located on the east side of Highway 101, including the fire-fighting water storage and associated appurtenances and piping;
- the water treatment plant located on the east side of Highway 101, including the buildings and furnishings, water storage, operational equipment, and associated appurtenances and piping;
- the wastewater treatment plant located along Railroad Avenue, including the buildings and furnishings, wetland treatment ponds, log pond, log pond clarifier, and operational equipment;
- the former Carpenter Shop, including the portions of the building known as the Paint Shop, the parking and yard areas, and associated tools and equipment, to be used as a corporation yard:
- the linear underground infrastructure including water transmission and distribution system, wastewater collection system, and storm water drainage system, after improvements and relocation to right-of-way, and associated appurtenances and piping;
- · the street lighting system including the period replica lampposts;
- the Scotia Volunteer Fire District building located at the intersection of Main Street and First Street, including office equipment, furniture, and fire-fighting equipment, and the Pipe Shop located in the basement with its contents;
- the Scotia Museum located between Main Street, B Street, and Eddy Street, including the museum building, its contents, and the landscaped grounds, picnic area, and various railroad and logging artifacts surrounding the building;
- the historic Winema Theatre located at the intersection of Main Street and Bridge Street, including the building, its contents, state-of-the-art audio-visual systems and cable television, and the landscaped grounds surrounding the building;
- the Baseball Park (a regulation irrigated and lighted baseball field with electric scoreboard, permanent bleachers, and a fully equipped snack bar) located between Williams Street and Railroad Avenue, including installations, bleachers, and parking area;
- the Community Soccer Park (a regulation irrigated soccer field with goals and a 60-seat bleacher system) located between Railroad Avenue and the Eel River, south of the wastewater treatment facility and northwest of the baseball field, including installations, bleachers, and parking area;

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- the Firemen's Park picnic area located in the vicinity of the Community Soccer Park, including pit barbecue, permanent tables, and restrooms;
- pocket parks located along Main Street associated with the Winema Theater and the Scotia Museum; and
- the Scotia Community Forest, a wooded buffer area along the Eel River.

In addition to the real property listed above, the following will be transferred from TOS to the SCSD:

- · a start-up fund of \$20,000 for initial office set-up and initial costs
- · an initial CSD contingency fund of \$135,000
- · easements/dedications for the new linear infrastructure
- one of the most valuable privately held water rights and licenses in California, which will be conveyed without reservation or reversion to the SCSD to put to any beneficial use allowed by law (This water right allows a diversion of up to 7.1 cubic feet per second from the Ecl River 24/7 year-round for domestic and industrial uses.)
- all rights to access, employ, and use the infrastructure and collect service fees as soon as the CSD is formed, even as TOS continues to assume responsibility for the infrastructure improvements
- $\cdot$  the rolling stock and operational equipment associated with the water and wastewater treatment facilities (see list below)
- · the rolling stock and operational equipment associated with the Fire District (see list below)
- all other rolling stock operational equipment attached to road maintenance, park, and street lighting services and general CSD operations and maintenance including backhoe, pickup trucks, generators, and hand tools from the Carpenter Shop, Paint Shop, and Pipe Shop to be conveyed to the SCSD, plus equipment located in the Garden Shop which will be relocated to the Carpenter Shop (see list below) (Note that the Garden Shop building itself is not planned to be conveyed to the SCSD.)

RE: Property Tax Exchange Agreement

Ms. Nilsen,

The Scotia Community Services District was officially formed in March of 2014, in response to the proposed subdivision by the Town of Scotia Company, LLC (TOS), which owns and leases all residences and most businesses in the community of Scotia. A subdivision application has been on file with Humboldt County since 2005. A tentative map was approved in November of 2009, and recordation of a final map and completion of conditions of approval for the first phase of the subdivision will be contemplated by the County in coming months. This first phase of subdivision approval will facilitate the sale of individual parcels, and provide for the transfer of assets from the TOS to the Scotia CSD. At this point, the Scotia CSD will be responsible for the provision of essential services, including water, wastewater, streets and street lighting, storm drainage, parks and recreation, and fire protection.

With the subdivision process reaching this important milestone, the District wishes to work cooperatively with the County to develop a fair and equitable approach to the sharing of real property ad valorem taxes imposed and collected as authorized by subsection (d) of Section 99 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code.

We anticipate growth in the assessed valuation of property within the District boundaries associated with the subdivision plan. There will be significant investments and improvements to public infrastructure for which the District will be responsible for operating and maintaining. We have been making substantial progress with budget forecasting, staffing plans, and rate setting processes. However, we feel strongly that the District should receive a share of property tax revenue attributable to the change in base value (i.e., property tax growth). Specifically, the base value should comprise of property taxes collected within the District's boundaries prior to subdivision approval as the base year from which to calculate the change in base value. This can be accomplished with the County's new Megabyte system.

The District would like to meet with County staff and further discuss entering into an agreement on the exchange of property tax within the District's boundaries. We want to discuss the feasibility of entering into a *master* property tax exchange agreement that can be applied to future phases of subdivision approval. At the April 7, 2016 SCSD Special Board meeting, staff introduced, for Board review and discussion; and at the April 21, 2016 Regular Board meeting the Board accepted, the following SHN Engineers & Geologists (SHN) documents;

- o Water User Rates Analysis and Recommendations,
- o Wastewater User Rates Analysis and Recommendations,
- o Fire Protection Engineer's Reports for Assessment of Benefits,
- o Parks and Recreation Engineer's Reports for Assessment of Benefits,
- o Streets and Street Lighting Engineer's Reports for Assessment of Benefits,
- o Storm Drainage Engineer's Reports for Assessment of Benefits; and
- o Combined User Fee and Benefit Assessment Reports Summary

The SCSD Board approved monthly User Fee/Benefit Assessment Rate of \$231-\$246 for the first five (5) fiscal years that was used to develop the attached SHN Water and Wastewater User Rate Analysis and Engineer's Report for Assessment of Benefits.

The SCSD Working Group has assisted staff in reviewing and editing the SHN User Rate Analyses and Engineer's Reports. The 218 noticing and balloting process requires finalization and Board approval of these documents. Additionally, staff used these documents to develop the 2016/17 fiscal year draft final budget for Board review and discussion.
