To Scotia Residents and Businesses,

****Update to the boil water advisory that was issued on March 4th, 2026****

After receiving complaints from Residents of Scotia being able to taste chlorine in the water. We would like to explain that the California Water Resources Control Board has mandated during the boil water advisory to keep chlorine residual at 2 parts per million. Today's chlorine readings at the Water Treatment Plant are within California Water Resources Control Board's mandated requirements during this boil water advisory.

Scotia Community Services District is still under a boil water advisory from the California Water Resources Control Board in conjunction with the Humboldt County Health Department, we are advising residents of Scotia CSD to only use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution to avoid stomach or intestinal illness.

This weekend Staff are flushing lines in the distribution system and you may notice turbid or discolored water while flushing.
